

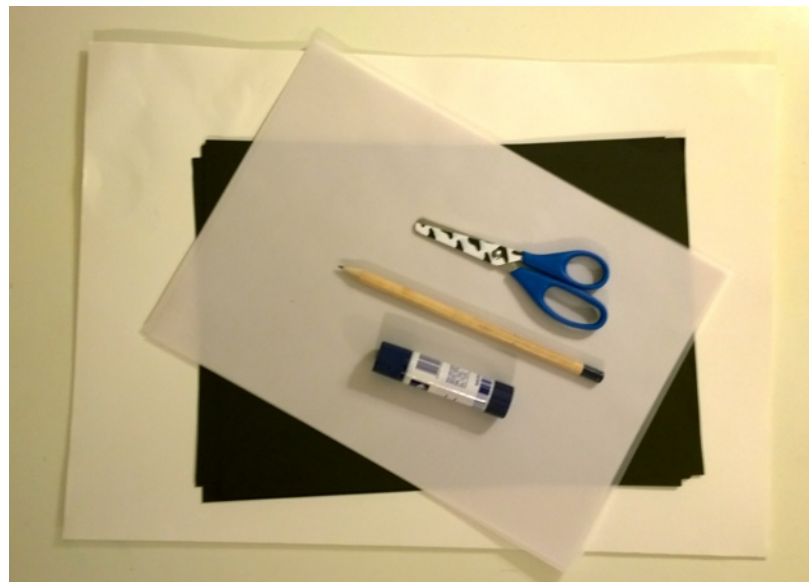
Layered Landscapes



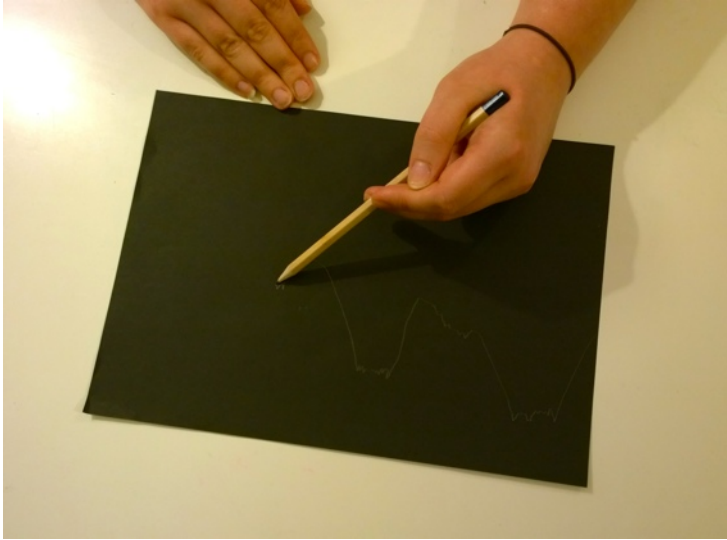
This is a really easy way to create depth in a landscape in a few simple steps

Tools and Materials:

- Tracing Paper
- Black Paper
- A3 White paper
- Pencil
- Prittstick
- Scissors



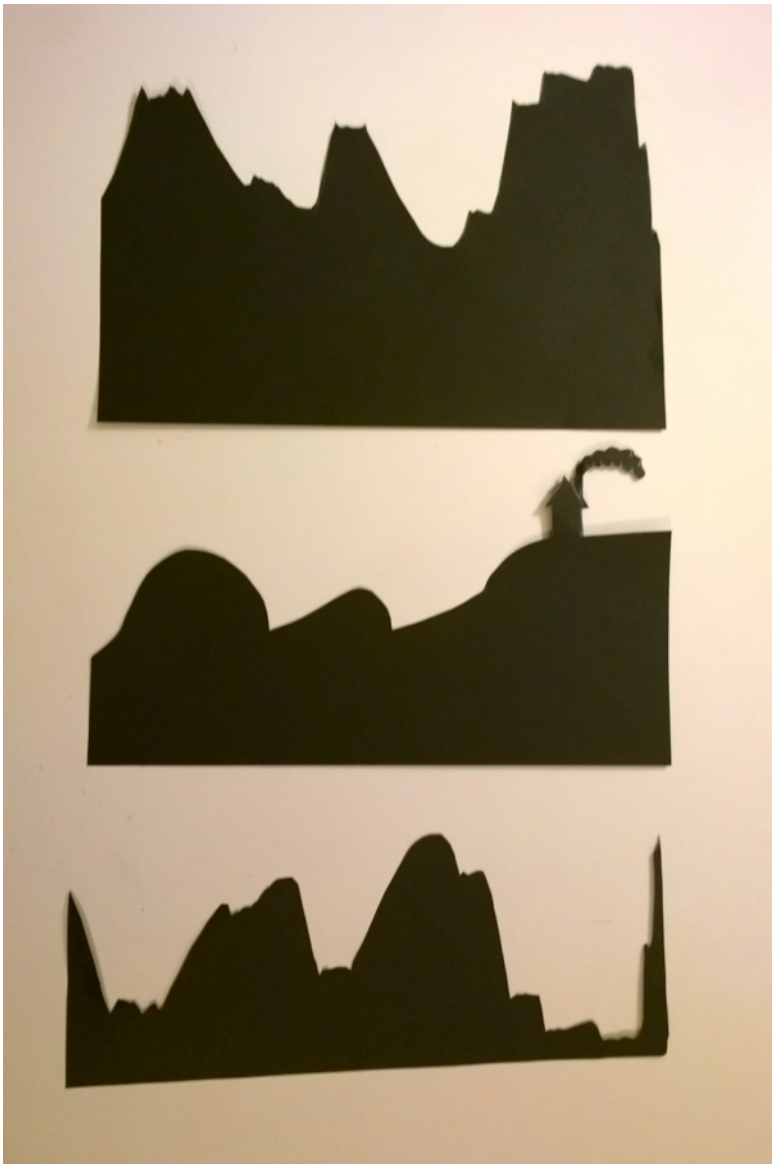
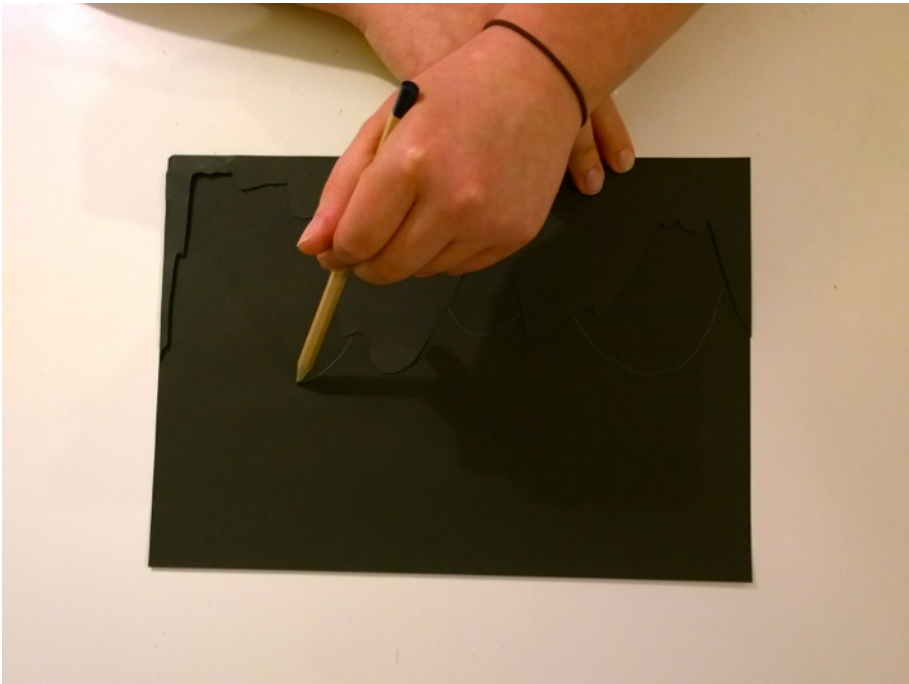
To start draw out the first layer of your landscape, these will be your largest hills - the things furthest away in your picture then cut it out



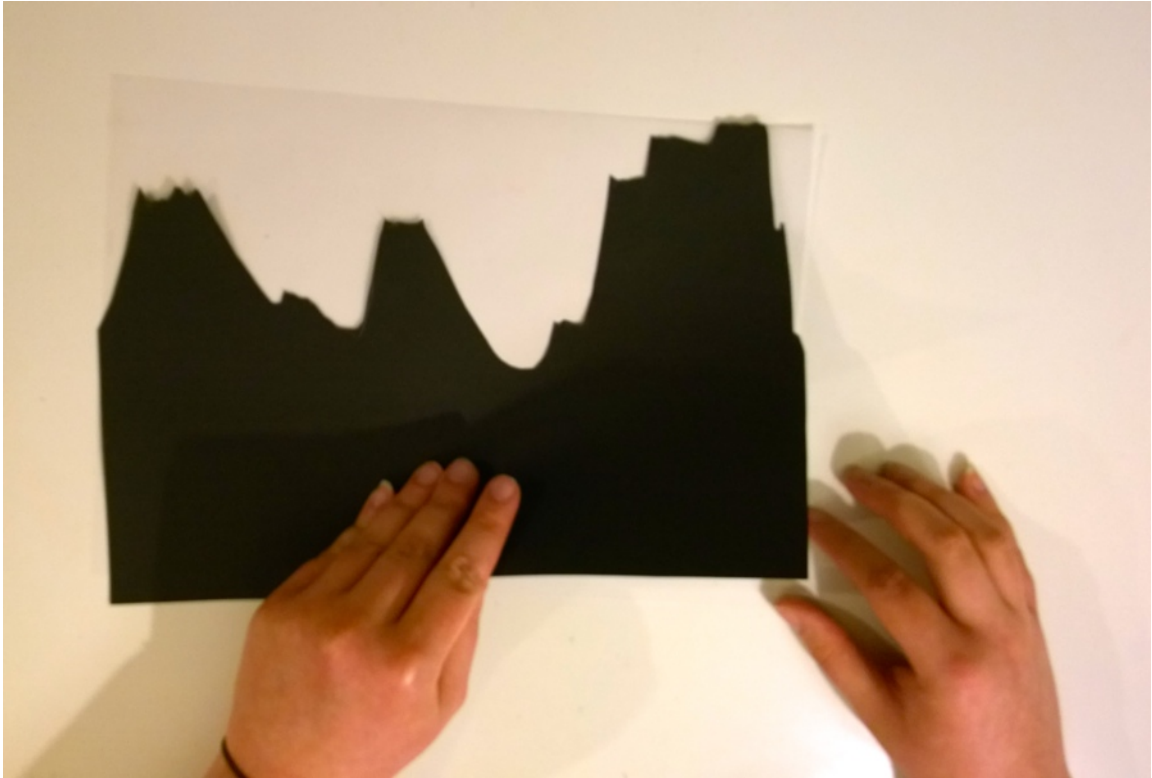
You could use the excess as the smallest layer (depending what shapes you have cut out)



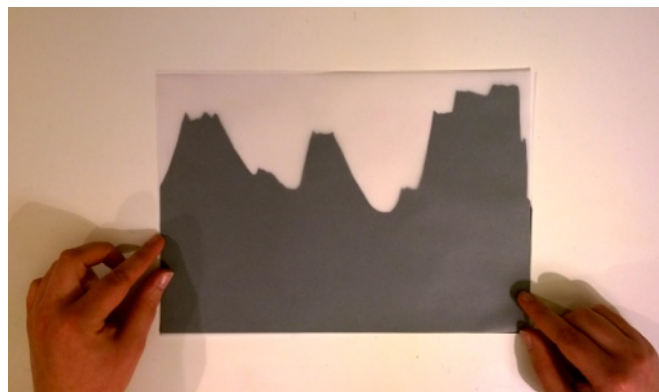
Now time to make the mid layer, as we are using the excess from our first one as our smallest layer we are using it as a guide to draw around then cut it out



Now the fun bit you can start putting your picture together, put your back layer on top of a piece of tracing paper



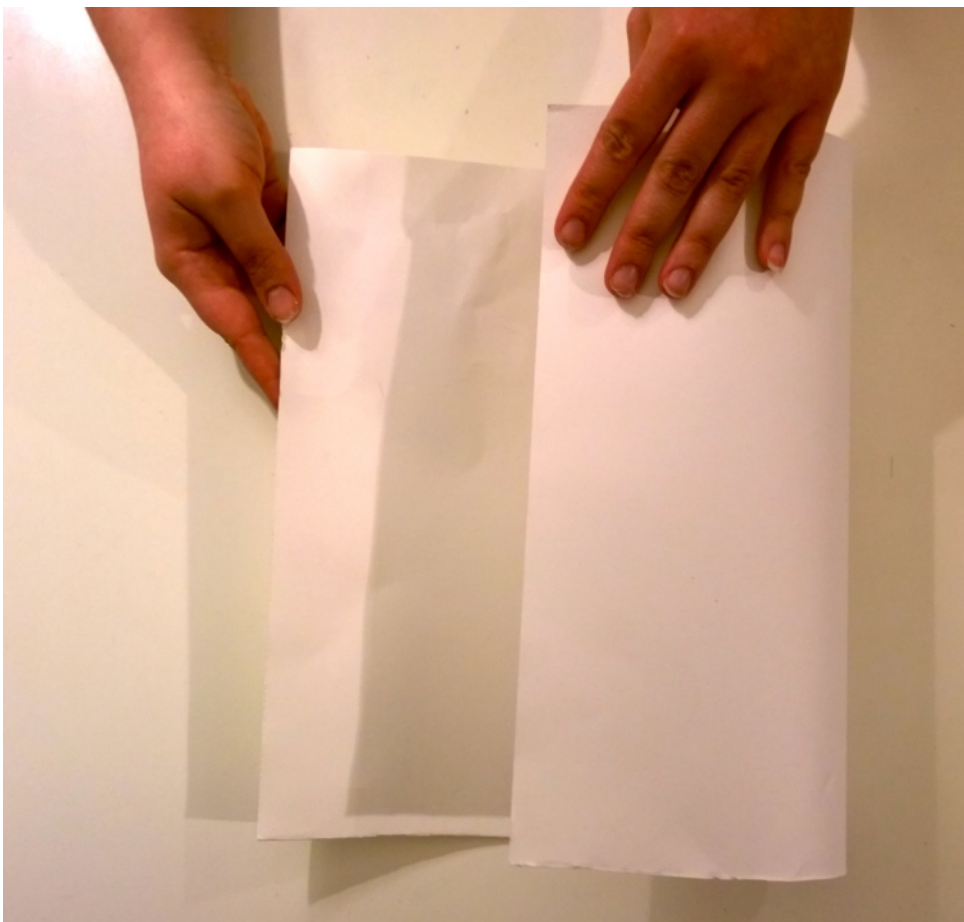
Now place another sheet of tracing paper on top and place your mid layer on top of that



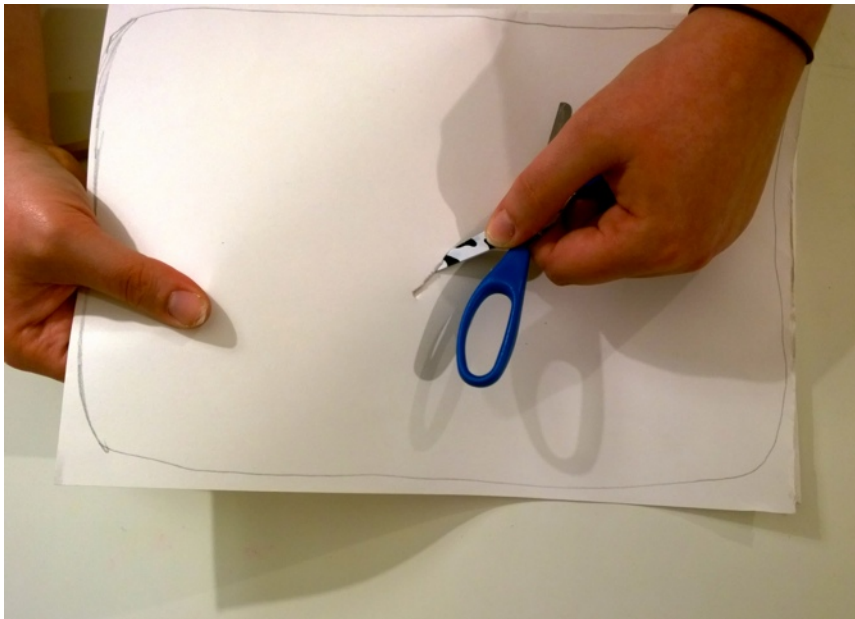
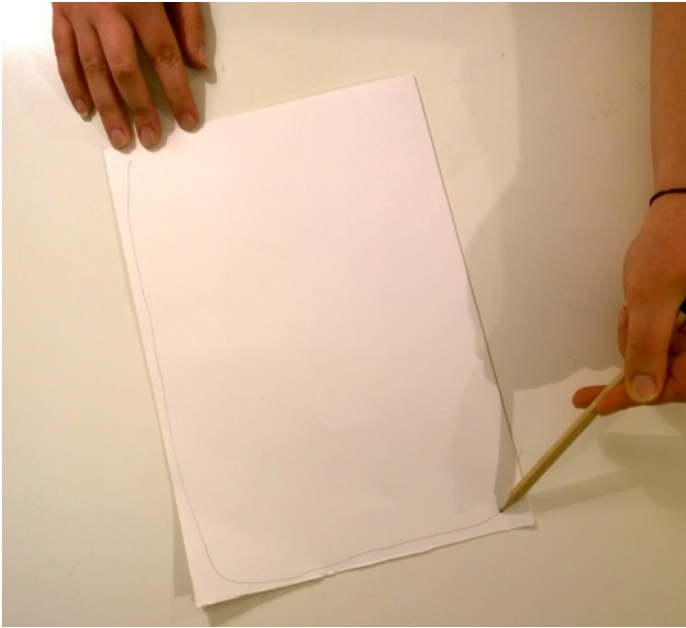
Place another piece of tracing paper on that then lastly place your smallest layer on top of that



Now time to make the picture frame to hold it all in, fold the A3 paper in half to sandwich your picture in



Draw a frame as close to the edges as possible and then cut it out



Place your drawing inside and glue round the edges, and there you have your layered landscape!
