Four Seasons Drawing






This is a fun way to create a piece of Art using the same main subject but changing the backgrounds to reflect the different seasons - who knows what you could create!

Tools and Materials:


- Paper
- Tracing Paper
- Pencil
- Felt Tips





First of all we need to divide our paper into four segments, you can do this by folding it - first of all in half like a card then fold it the other way to create your sections like so






Your paper should end up looking like this - one section for each season!




Now you can start creating your design - what character would you like to draw? We thought a hedgehog would be fun - it doesn't matter which section you start in so get creating!



Once you are happy with your character then we can trace with the tracing paper to replicate your character through the other seasons. Tracing paper means you can create exactly the same drawing again and again with a lot more ease and speed than drawing it every time! Put the tracing paper over your drawing and follow the lines to draw it on top like so




You should end up with something looking like this




To make tracing paper work you need to draw on the back of it - following the lines, make sure you go over every line!



Once you have done that you can add your character to the other sections - make sure they are the right way round!



If the tracing paper stops working draw on the back again to create more lead to transfer on to your paper



Then start adding in the seasons! We jumped straight into colour for this but you can of course draw it out in pencil first - whichever you find easiest!



For the finishing touches you can black outline your drawing just to make it really stand out



And there you have it your very own "Four Seasons Drawing"
