

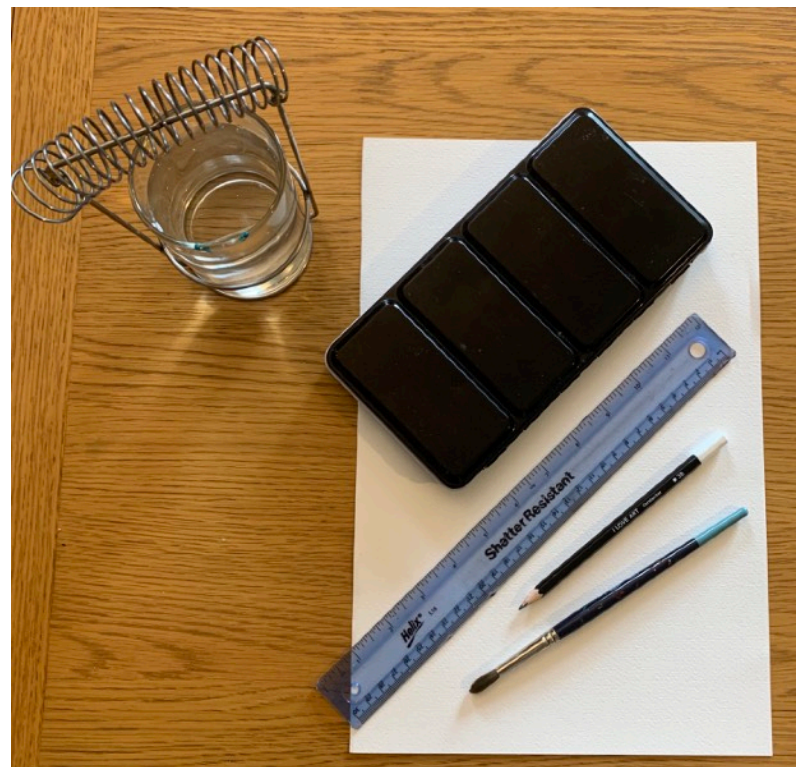
## Art Focus: Kandinsky



Taking inspiration from Wassily Kandinsky who is thought of as the inventor of Abstract Art why not create some work in his style like these colourful circles

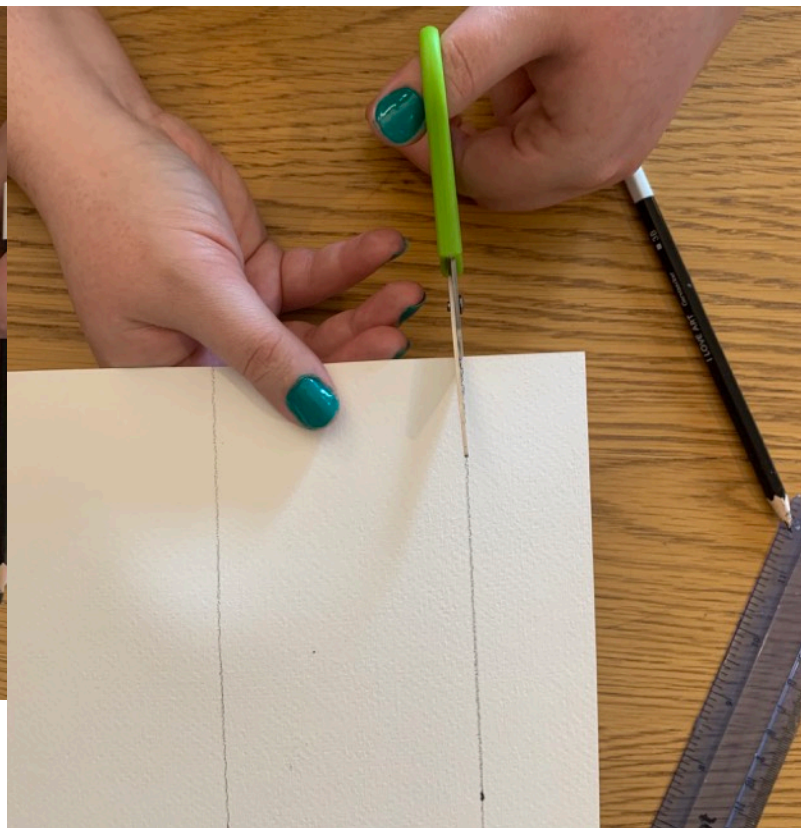
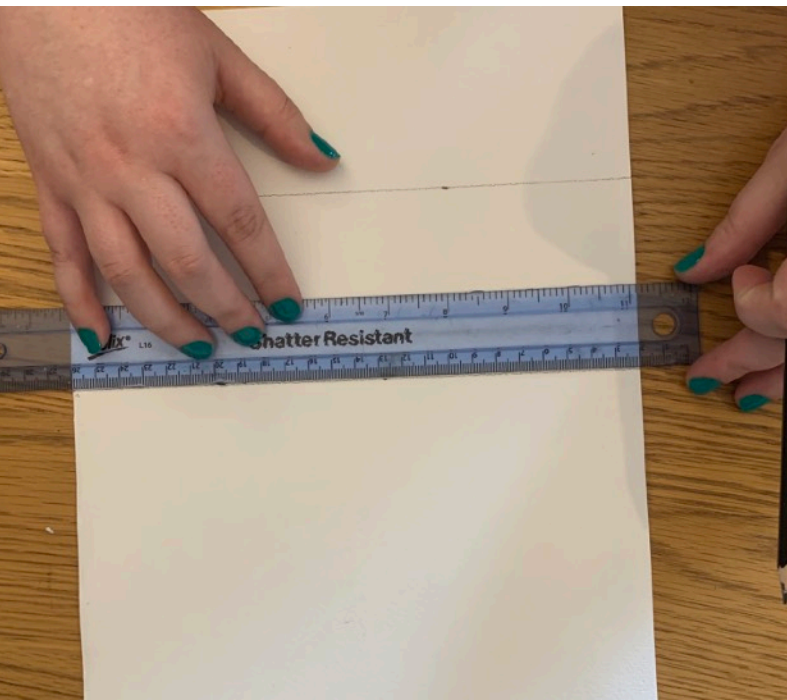
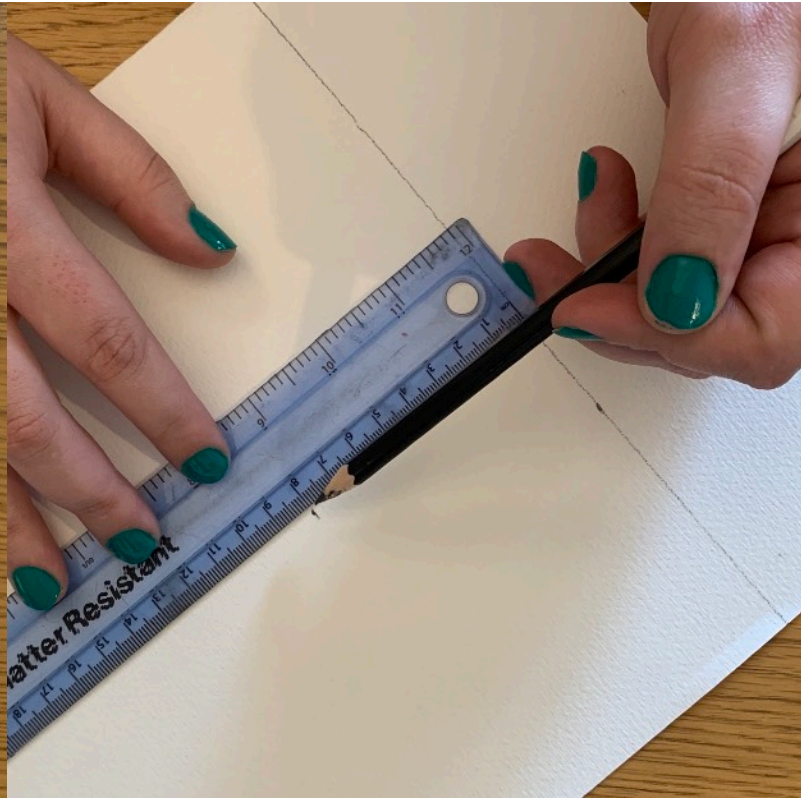
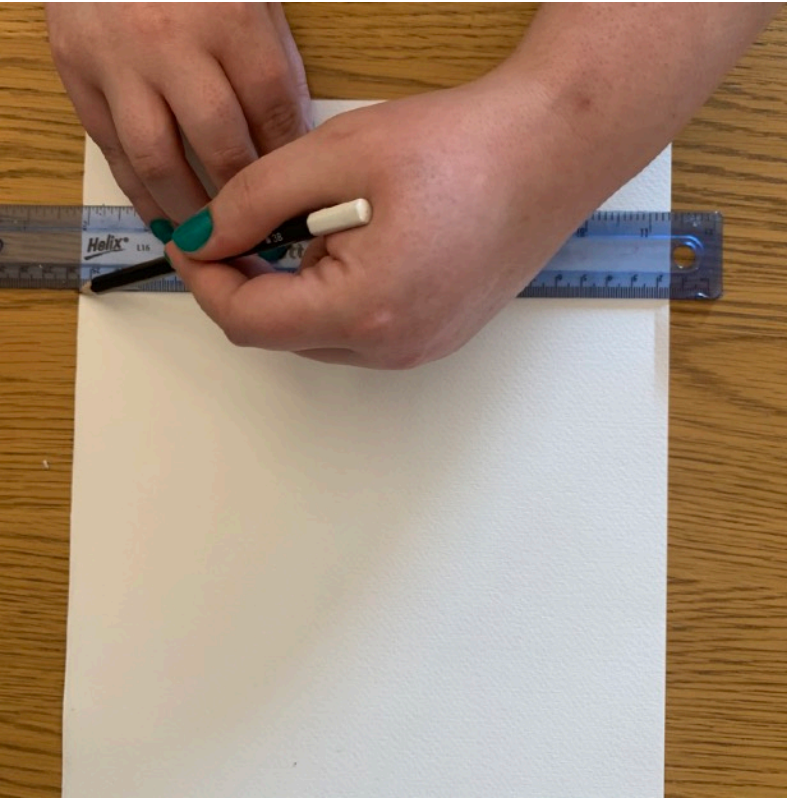
Tools and Materials:

- Watercolour

- Paintbrush



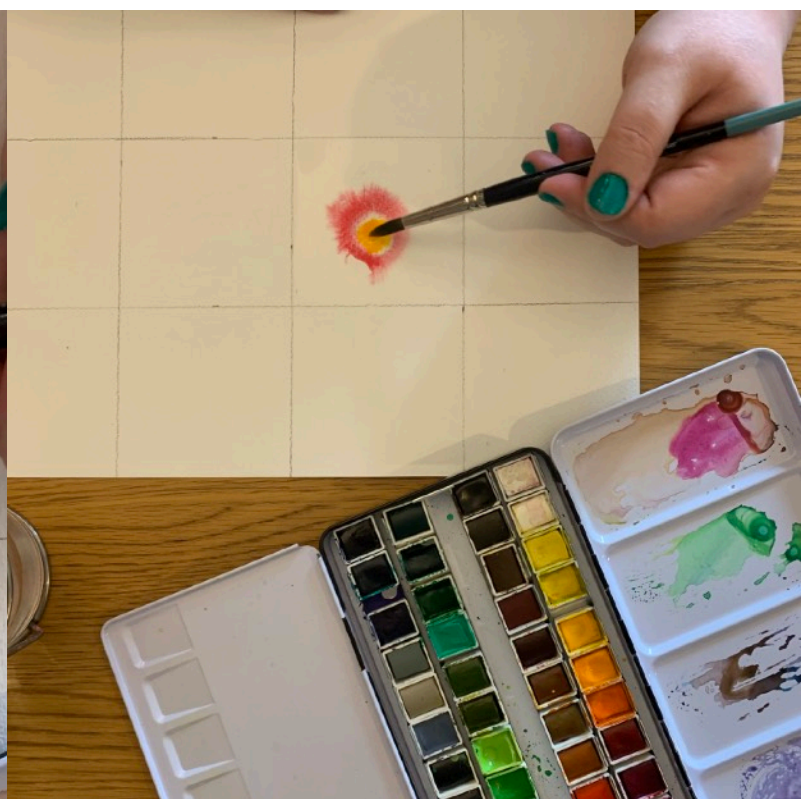
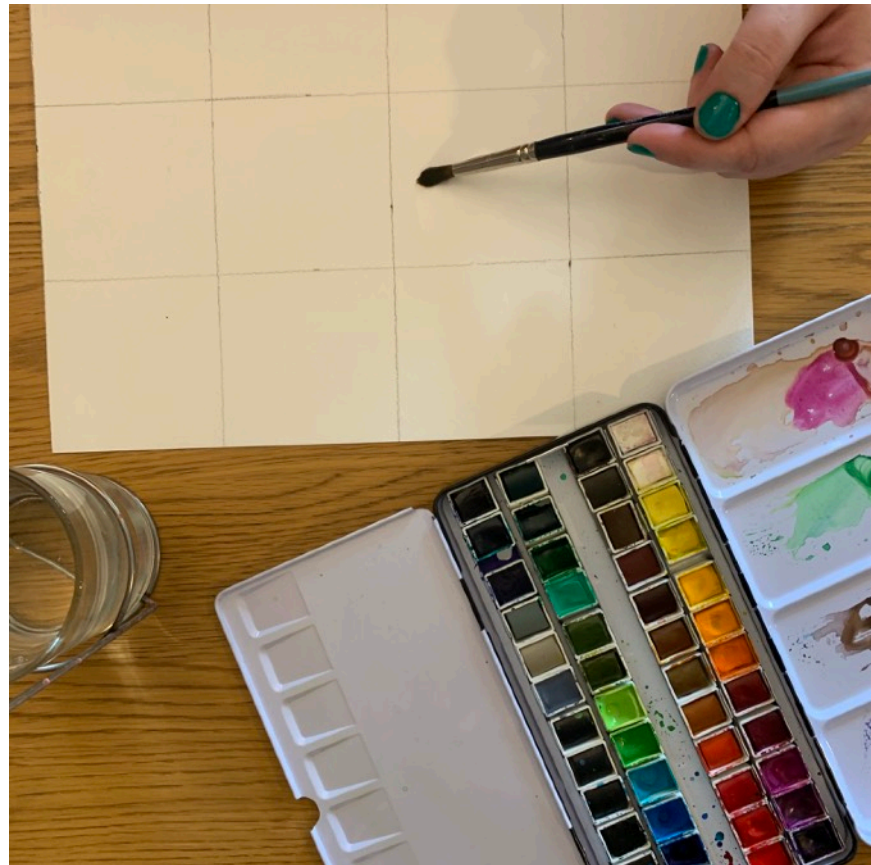
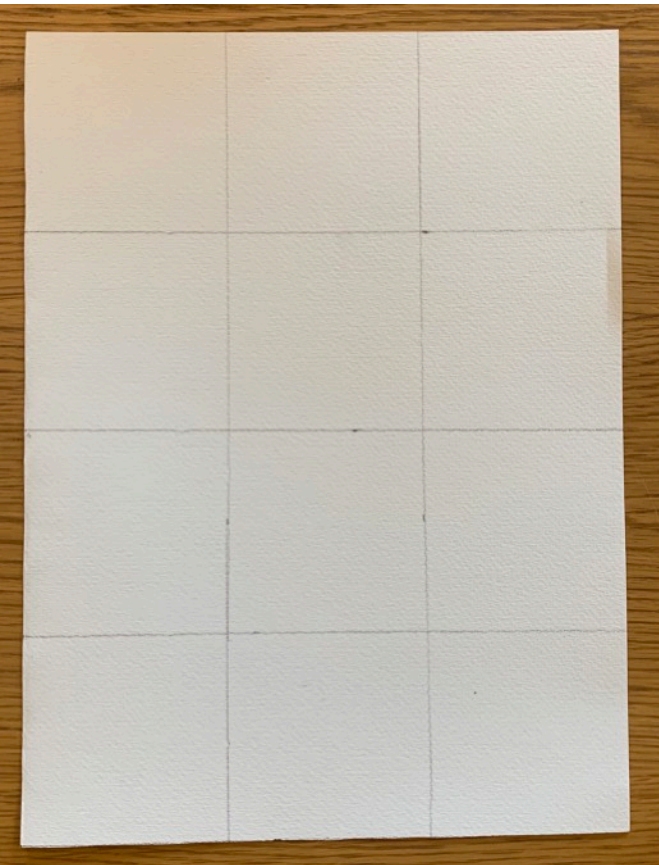


Start off by drawing a grid to create equal size squares - you might need to trim some of the page off if it won't divide equally, we chose 8x8cm for our squares





Once you have your squares ready you can think about beginning to paint. With watercolour they can be used in different ways - for this project if you put water on the paper before adding the colour you will get a great blended effect





Continue filling in the squares with different colours - thinking about how the colours compliment or contrast with each other.
