

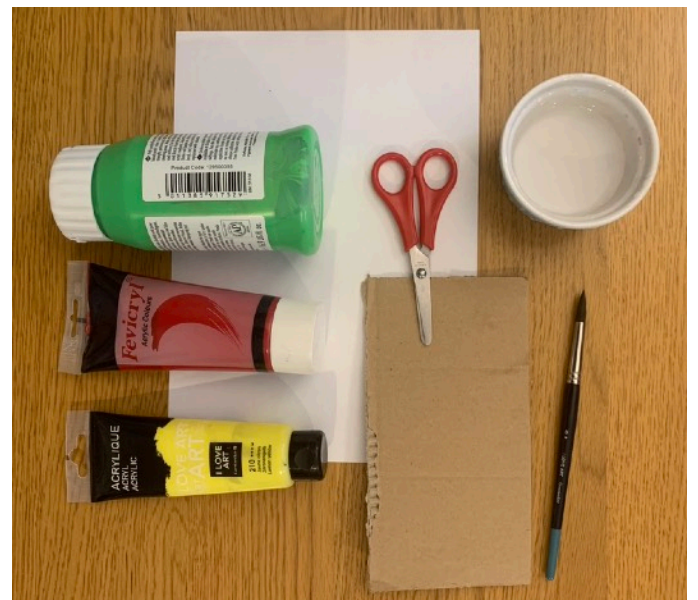
Cardboard Christmas Printing



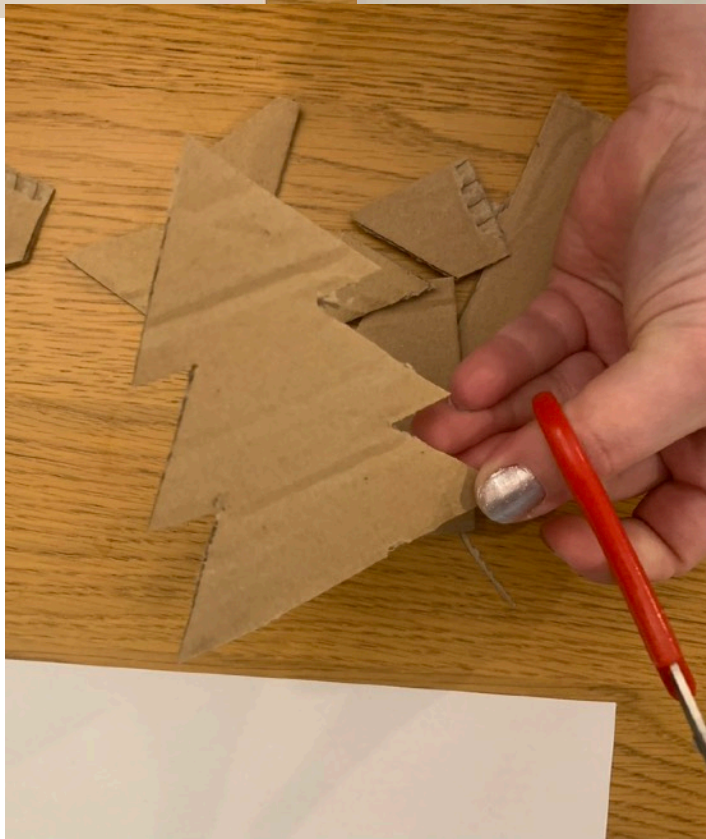
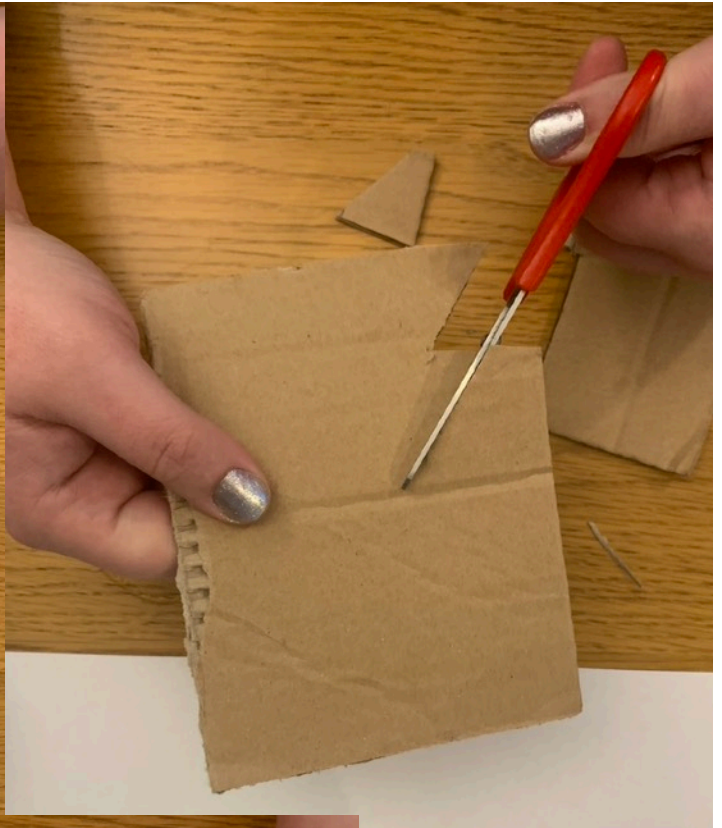
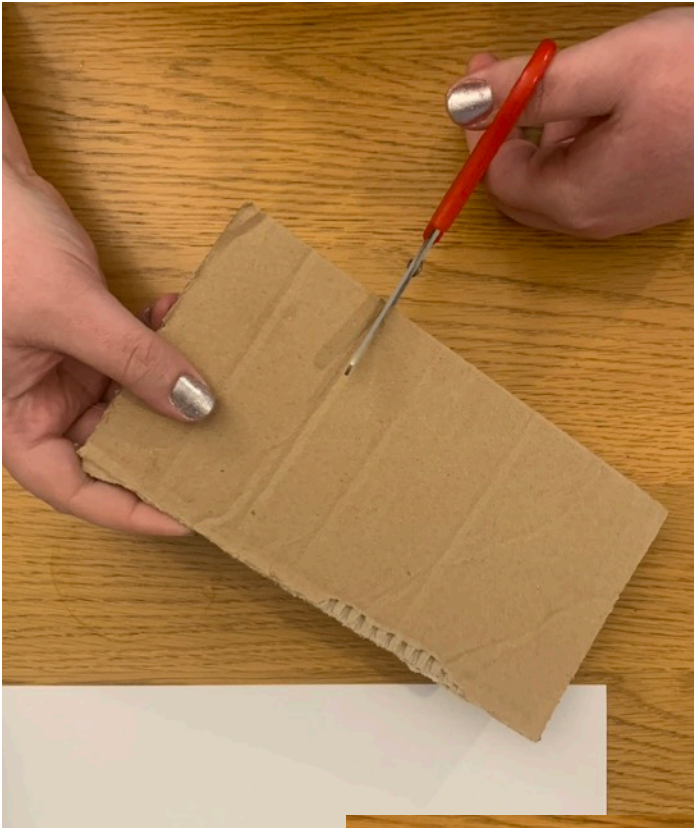
Why not create your own Christmas Cards, gift tags and more with this simple printmaking technique!

Tools and Materials:

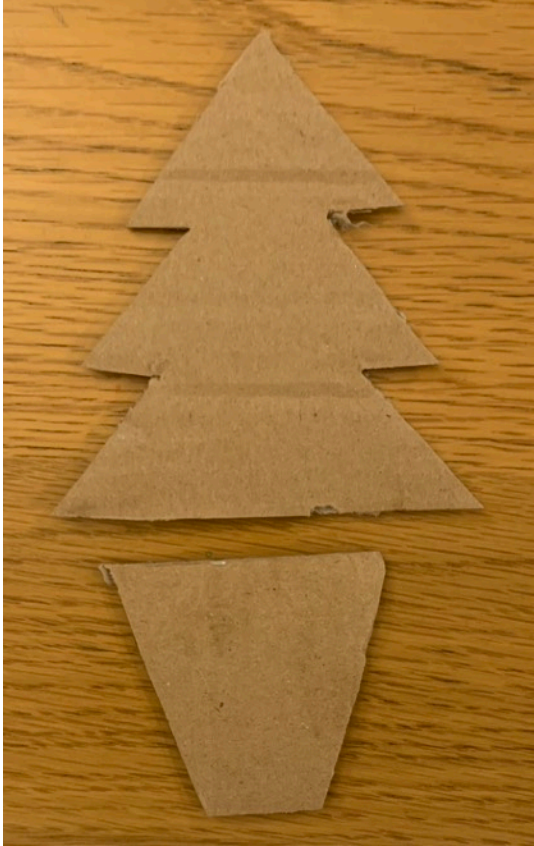
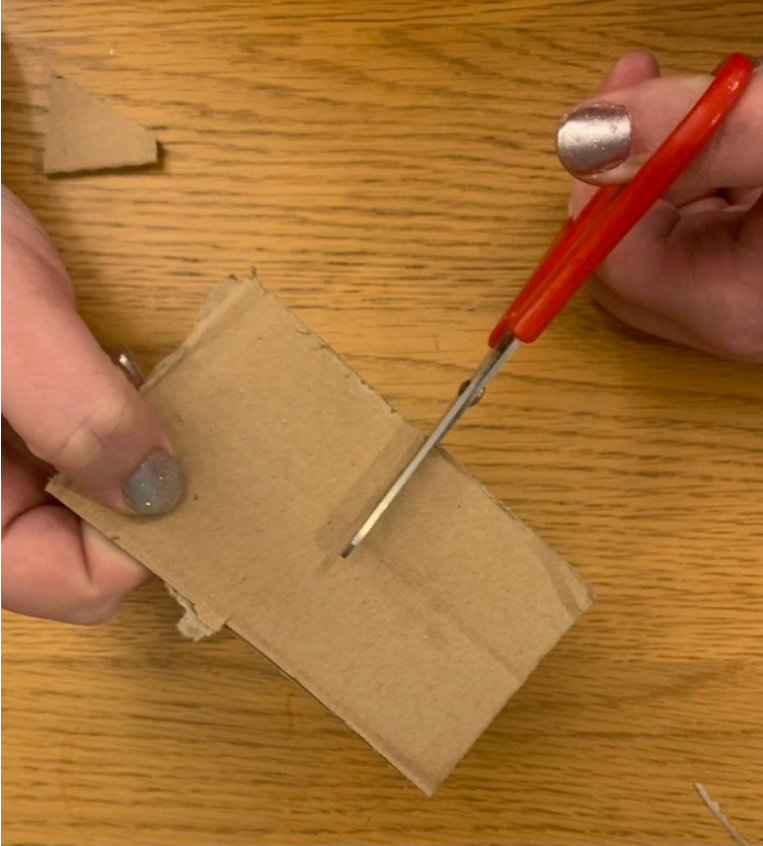
- Paper
- Paint
- Water
- Paintbrush
- Scissors
- Cardboard



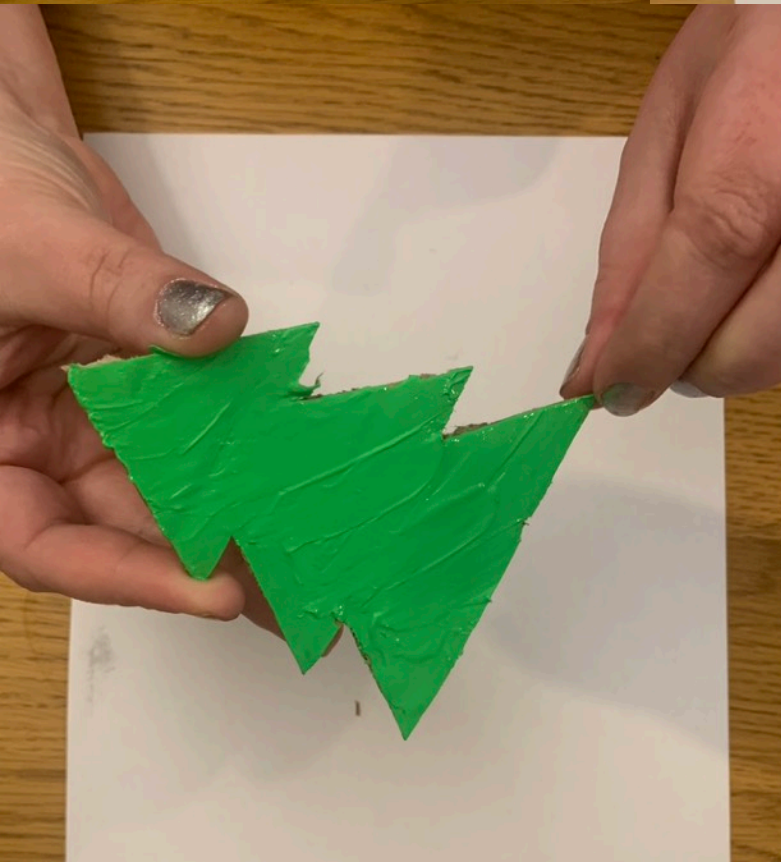
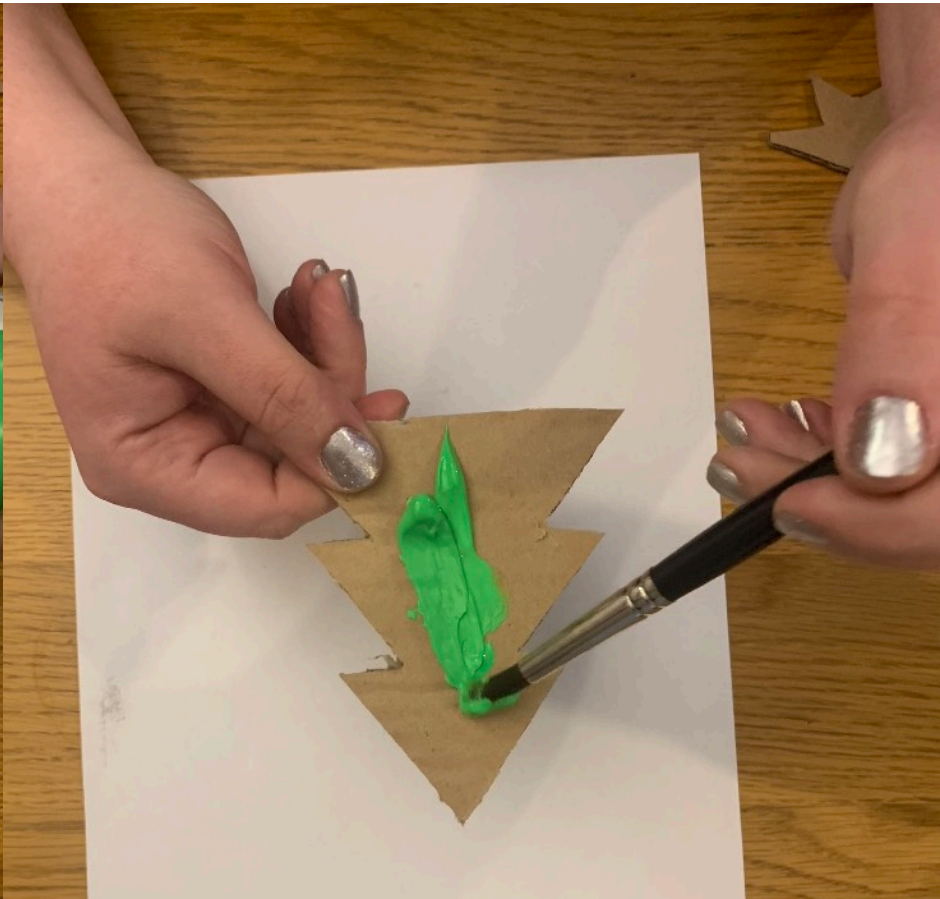
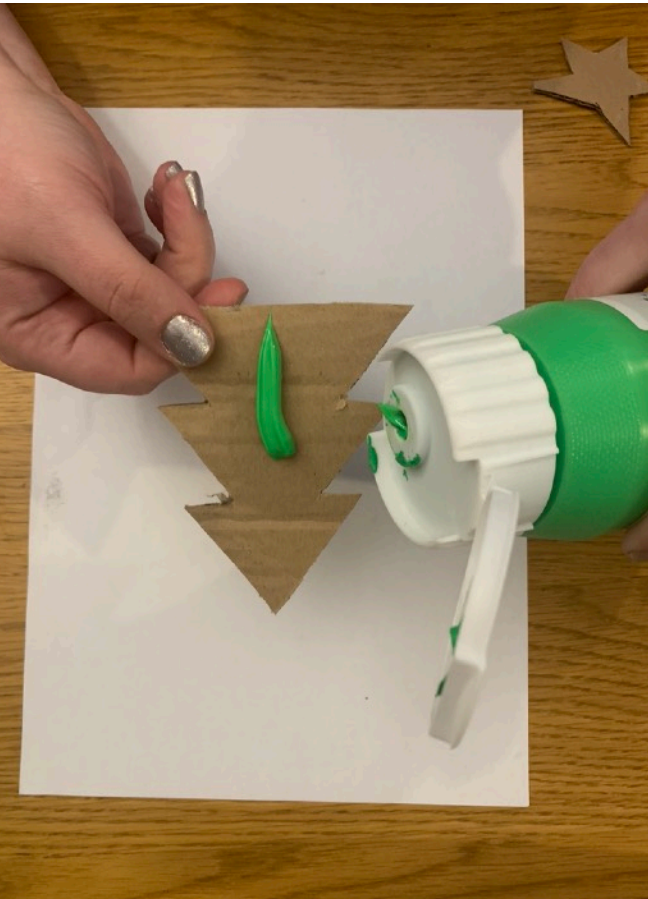
You can use cardboard from a cardboard box, you want it to be that thickness so you can easily pick it up again. First think about what it is you want to make, we thought a Christmas tree would be fun, so we cut our cardboard into a larger size for the tree and a smaller portion for the pot like so. Zig in and out to cut the tree, we didn't use a pencil you can if you like



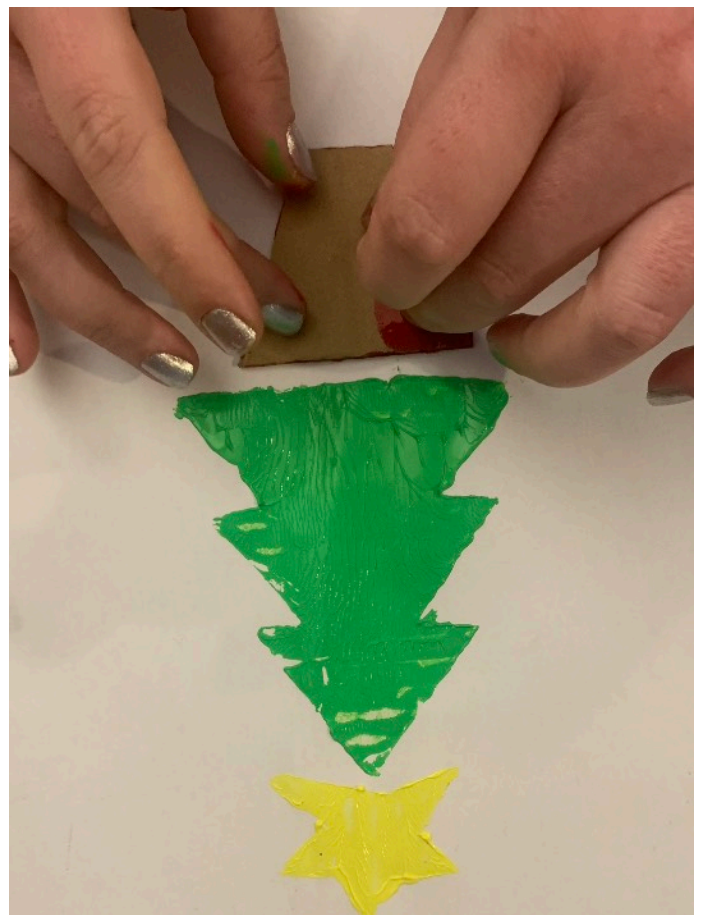
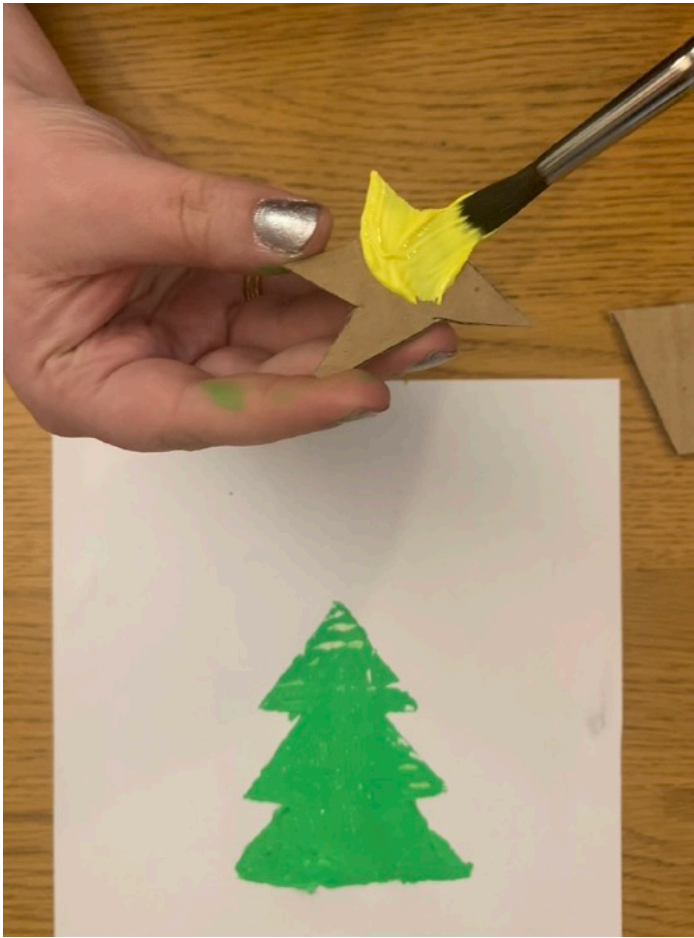
Taking the smaller part we cut earlier cut out a pot and then using a scrap bit can cut out a star too!



Now to print! You can squeeze the paint directly onto the cardboard and then use the brush to spread it evenly, we started with the tree and green. Once covered in paint place paint side down on your paper, push it leave for a few seconds then pull it off the paper gently



Wash your brush and dry your brush off so isn't dripping in between colour changes and repeat for the star and pot



There you have it your very own
“Cardboard Christmas Print”!
